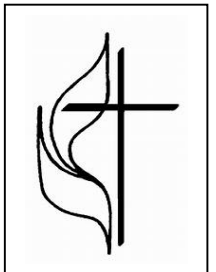

The Sacrament of Holy Communion for Kingdomtide

Leader: God be with you.

PEOPLE: And also with you.

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

PEOPLE: We lift them up to God.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the God of unity and love.

PEOPLE: It is right to give God our thanks and praise.

Leader: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Almighty God, creator of heaven and earth.

In the beginning, you swept across the earth with your Spirit of life and renewal. From the earth's first gardens to mountaintop storms, you have spoken and called us into covenant to be your holy people.

When we wandered away and fell short of your call, you spoke yet again, calling us to walk in your ways. From laws on tablets to warnings from prophets, you have spoken your truth and renewed your covenant with us, reviving our souls and rekindling our holy calling with your grace and love.

And so, with your people on earth, and all the company of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

PEOPLE: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Leader: Holy are you, and blessed is your holy name. In the fullness of time, you sent Jesus Christ to call us to new life and renewed faith.

Through Christ's powerful love and endless grace, we are invited into your presence, rescued from our sins, and led on your path of justice and righteousness. In Christ's grace, you revive us and make us whole.

As children of your new covenant, sealed by water

and the Spirit, we come to you now with joy and gratitude, remembering how Jesus shared bread and wine, renewing and reviving the lives of his friends, his most faithful disciples, even as they faced their deepest fears and their greatest sins.

On that night before his death, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to the disciples, and said, “Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.”

When the supper was over, Jesus took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to the disciples, and said, “Drink from this, all of you; this is my life in the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.”

And so, in remembrance of these, your life-giving acts of love and grace, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as children of your covenant, renewed and redeemed by your grace, in union with Christ’s love for us, as we proclaim the mystery of our faith.

PEOPLE: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Leader: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and juice. Make them be for us the life and love of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed and revived by Christ’s love and grace.

Live in us, that by your Spirit, we might be one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet.

Through Jesus Christ, and with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty God, now and forevermore.
