#### LAY MEMBER TO NEW ENGLAND ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT

Hello, here is my report from the hybrid New England Annual Conference that took place from Tuesday June 7th to Saturday June 11th. I did not attend all the sessions due to other commitments, but I have the recap from the NEAC website to fill in the gaps. If you wish to look at the website you can find things such as full videos of speeches and ceremonies.

Scripture for the conference: Philippians 3:12-14 from the Message translation

I'm not saying that I have this all together, that I have it made. But I am well on my way, reaching out for Christ, who has so wondrously reached out for me. Friends, don't get me wrong: By no means do I count myself an expert in all of this, but I've got my eye on the goal, where God is beckoning us onward— to Jesus. I'm off and running, and I'm not turning back.

**June 7th:** The laity celebration was held via zoom on Tuesday night. Bishop Devedhar addressed the body with his message of hope. He reported on his work with youth and laity and encouraged us to live out our baptismal vows.

Our guest speaker was David Teel. He is the director of discipleship ministries. He described the secret of life as being still and listening, then entering into holy conversation. David recommended a book called **Soul Reset** by Junius Dotson.

We then heard a report from Betty Shippee, president of the United Women of Faith (formerly known as UMW).

The United Methodist Men gave a report from Tom Leech. He spoke of an app for men called **Live Bold**. It has daily devotionals. The UMM also includes scouting ministries. Their website is umcmen.org.

Wanda Winnicki told of her ministry as a Deaconess.

Michael Leonard spoke about the work of the Earth Keepers.

Jen Jordan reported on Lay Servant and Certified Lay Minister programs.

Upcoming dated: October 16th is Laity Sunday.

**June 8th:** The clergy session was held on Wednesday.

**June 9th:** The annual conference was called to order in the morning. A new conference secretary was elected. Her name is Preeti Pabreja. She did a wonderful job.

Our guest speaker and study leader was introduced. She is Bishop LaTrelle Easterling. She is currently in the Baltimore-Washington and Peninsula Delaware conferences, and is originally from New England.

Bishop Devadhar then gave his Episcopal address. He talked about the confusing state of the Methodist Church in a reassuring way and spoke of the prize of the upward call. He told us we must speak up and noted the effects of saying nothing. His book list consists of Journeys from Here to There by Susan J. Cohen, Both/And by Jason

**Moore,** and **Protest at Midnight by Peter Storey.** You can hear the full address on the neac website.

We then took a ballot for Episcopal Nomination. As you may know, Bishop Devadhar is retiring. We will get a new bishop in January 2023. Those nominated by the body are Rene Perez and Thom Blackstone.

The next item was the 2023 conference budget. The budget was approved. CCFA is particularly pleased to be presenting a budget that reflects a 10 percent decrease in Connectional Mission Shares billable to local churches totaling \$100,000," she said. "The 2023 budget continues a steady decrease in overall expenses since 2020 that now totals more than \$1 million.Rev. Bischoff also announced that CCFA plans to review "several long-standing Conference rules related to Mission Shares" to consider how they are applied and whether they are still relevant. CCFA expects to bring a report to the 2023 Annual Conference session.

A memorial service was held with Bishop Easterling giving the message.

Green Mountain District Superintendent Rev. Jill Colley Robinson, who serves as Dean of the Cabinet, gave the annual State of the Conference report.

**RS-223** CLOSURE OF CHRIST CHURCH UNITED METHODIST, SOUTHWICK, MA Tim Riddle, who journeyed on a Mission of Peace, shared his thoughts about these journeys of shalom and recommended this video of other MOPers sharing their stories Conference Statistician Joy Mueller gave her annual report on looking at New England by the numbers and shared some of the amazing ministry stories those numbers reveal.

#### **Ziegler Preacher**

McAvoy serves Shepherd of the Valley UMC in Hope, RI.She said, "even in my lack of faith, I still have faith that God is going to ... and God is doing ... a new thing in New England. There's hope. There's always hope. You must lead the people with hope," Rev. McAvoy said, crediting that thought to one of her teachers, the late Rev. Dr. Seth Asari.
