By 12:40 we were out of hot dogs and a line of people that reached almost to the MTM Center had to be turned away. LAY MEMBER TO NEW ENGLAND ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT, CONT.

The New England Annual Conference (NEAC) Board of Church and Society proposes that we work with the Connectional Table and CFA to discuss the creation of a part-time position of climate coordinator to be hired by the NEAC. This person would be responsible for offering resources and expertise to local congregations and other conference entities about how to respond to the climate crisis by adapting their properties and/or becoming effective advocates to combat climate change. This person should demonstrate knowledge of climate science, resources available in New England, and have a passion for climate care and advocacy. The structuring of this position will be done in consultation with CCFA and Connectional table to develop who the person reports to and the finances necessary for this part-time position. The Board of Church and Society will of course be willing to work with everyone to help this happen.
