GREETINGS FROM YOUR LAY LEADER

As I write this I am thinking about November, Thanksgiving, and gratitude. I am so grateful for so many things; God, our church, my family and friends. I could go on and on. Try thinking of things you are grateful for. I suggest we take it one step further and during the month of November spend some time each day remembering things we are grateful for. Think of it as a Thanksgiving calendar, like an advent calendar.

To help us along, try reading Psalm 100:

Shout with joy to the Lord, all the earth!

Worship the Lord with gladness.

Come before the Lord, singing with joy.

Acknowledge that the Lord is God!

The Lord made us, and we are the Lord's.

We are the Lord's people, the sheep of the Lord's pasture.

Enter the Lord's gates with thanksgiving;

Go into the Lord's courts with praise.

Give thanks to the Lord and praise the Lord's name.

For the Lord is good.

The Lord's unfailing love continues forever,

And the Lord's faithfulness continues to each generation.

Eugene Peterson's *The Message* says: "Enter with the password; 'Thank you'!" The way into the presence of God is to give praise and thanks.

Each day start your gratitude meditation with a psalm, like Psalm 100. Then think of all the ways you are grateful. End with a prayer: Thank you God, for all you have given me!

GREETINGS FORM YOUR LAY LEADER, CONT.

My monthly letter would not be complete without a book report. I recently read: Journeys From There to Here; Stories of Immigrant Trials, Triumph, and Contributions by Susan J. Cohen with Stephen T. Taylor. Published by River Grove Books.

Susan J. Cohen is an immigration lawyer, and in her book she tells the stories of eleven immigrants and their battles to stay in the U.S. I think this is a book worth reading, especially as we listen to the news about "bad illegals" and "drug criminals". The people described in the book are from all over the world. They have wonderful gifts that are now being shared in this country.

I learned many things about immigration and its complex laws. Some of it is difficult to understand. Imagine if you didn't speak the language or understand the rules? This is the life of many immigrants. (Remember those who were tricked into going to Martha's Vineyard.) There is a non profit group called PAIR which works to help thousands of asylum seekers pro bono. I also learned that there are different types of visas with different limitations. There is asylum for Extraordinary Ability to help gifted people find a place in America. The paperwork for any type of asylum is huge. It takes months, even years to assemble affidavits and proof of credentials. All this from countries that do not provide these things to their people who are seeking safety here from death threats. The immigrant has to secure a temporary green card and then apply for permanent residence. Without these things the person cannot work or obtain a work permit or visa. They also do not qualify for federal help without the legal documents. Therefore, the idea that we are helping illegals with our welfare system is incorrect.

I hope you will take the time to read about this issue, especially in this book. It made me grateful to live in a free country without legal restraint.


