#### FROM YOUR LAY LEADER

As I write this I am looking at the buds on my rosebush outside my window. Spring is coming even if there is still a chill in the air. It's time to come out of hibernation and look forward to some new activities. Spring also means that it's time to prepare for annual conference. I'll be attending via zoom this year. There will be a pre conference meeting, also by zoom, which I will attend or watch the recording. There are so many things to do: attend my granddaughter's college graduation, celebrate birthdays with my mother and mother-in-law, sing in a spring concert, celebrate mother's day, and join in with the church's spring fling.

I had the privilege of attending a time of welcome for our interim bishop, Peggy Johnson. Bishop Johnson has come out of retirement to serve our conference for a year and a half. She is an energetic, loving, and brilliant person, with the gift of good administration added in. Bishop Johnson spoke to us about going back to basics, serving the community, and loving the unlovable. She gave us a list of her accomplishments since she took office in January. She has done a lot to get our conference organized. Bishop Johnson has served as a bishop in Maryland, Delaware, and Pennsylvania. She also led a deaf church for many years. She gave us buttons with the sign for I Love You on them. She has written a wonderful book called The Ever Expansive Spirit of God: Hope for All Who Feel Left Out. I have read it already and passed it on to the congregation. I hope you will read it when it makes its way to you. The book is a memoir of Bishop Johnson and her ministry. She also explains about the journey of the Methodist Church in a clear and concise way. Those of you who have questions and those who don't know what the questions are yet will definitely benefit from this book. I look forward to conference with her presiding in her loving way.

My book report for this month is Silent Compassion; Finding God in Contemplation, by Richard Rohr. Rohr is a Franciscan priest who has written many books. I found this book a bit difficult in some places, and helpful in others. The book reminds us that there are some themes, or truths that are the same for all religions, no matter what they are named. In 1 Corinthians Paul says "There is a variety of gifts, but it is always the same Spirit. There are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord, working in all sorts of different ways in different people. It is the same God working in all of them." 12:4-6.

As the title hints, God can be found in silence. Silence precedes and grounds creativity. As Americans, we tend to think we need stimulation. Rohr says that silence around a thing adds meaning. Without it, we are just reacting instead of thinking. Spiritual silence calls us to be present in the moment. Instead of taking sides, silence allows contentment and enrichment. True prayer or contemplation is a leap into community. Contemplation leads you to have simple clear eyes, common-sense faith, and loving energy that makes whatever you say quite

compelling. I think Rohr would agree that as Bishop Johnson says, spiritual silence leads us to "love the unlovable."

#### BREAKFAST WITH THE EASTER BUNNY

Thanks to all who made Breakfast with the Easter bunny such a big success. As always, the kitchen crew did a great job cooking pancakes and sausage. Everyone enjoyed seeing the Easter bunny; even the shy kiddos who kept their distance but waved to the bunny while eating. We served 41 kids, 55 adults and 10 volunteers. We also collected over 25 pounds of pet food, toys, treats and blankets that were donated to the Greater Androscoggin Humane Society. This is such a great community event that grows every year.



#### JUST SENIORS

After canceling twice due to bad weather, a representative from Springworks Farm located right here in Lisbon, presented a very informative program to 16 attendees on April 17<sup>th</sup>. Springworks Farm is the largest aquaponics greenhouse in New England, and has recently secured funding to build a fourth greenhouse. This greenhouse of 120,000 square feet will be their largest one yet. With this expansion, their work force will add 40 new jobs, produce 5,000,000 heads of organic lettuce and 315,000 pounds of tilapia each year! They are hoping that after the greenhouse is up and running they will once again be able to give tours of their facility, which the attendees of the program are looking forward to. The Narrative Budget in the campaign mailer illustrates the breakdown of expenses covered by the annual budget. Our bare-bones operating budget for 2023, totaling \$138,160.63, is paid with your pledged (& pifts, fundraisers and special donations. Your pledges help the Finance Committee plan ahead and prepare for any budgetary shortages -- making it an important decision for each of us. Increasing one's pledge by just one dollar a week helps a LOT with keeping the heat on in winter, retaining a full-time minister, and continuing our community missions. Just think -- how many ways would our community be impacted if our church wasn't here?

If you haven't submitted your pledge card yet, it isn't too late to send it in! There are extra pledge cards available in the Narthex, along with boxes of offering envelopes, if needed.
