We lit a candle and shared the names of each person whose life was lost in the mass shooting before sharing this time of prayer:

A Prayer for the Victims of the Lewiston Shooting by our Many Waters District Superintendent, Rev. Arlene Tully (adapted)

God of the brokenhearted, our world has once again been shaken by violence and gunfire – this time in the last place we expected – right here in our own backyard. We are in shock, grieving, and confused.

We pray for the loved ones of the 18 people whose lives were taken – the loved ones whose lives will never be the same. We pray that the presence and power of your Holy Spirit will companion them, comfort them, strengthen and support them – that you would work through caring friends and family to provide a reassuring hug, a listening ear, a shoulder to cry on. And we pray that in the days to come you will work through the clergy, chaplains, and grief counselors who offer a safe space for survivors to process their grief and begin the long road to healing.

God of the innocent, we pray especially for the children who were bowling one moment and fleeing from bullets the next. Bind up their wounds, whether physical or emotional, and enable them to recover fully from the trauma. God of compassion, we give thanks for the courageous first responders who rushed to help the victims – for police officers, firefighters and EMTs, and all those whose duties brought them face to face with the carnage of gun violence. We thank you for the doctors, nurses, and other medical specialists who were in the places where they were most needed. We praise you for unknown bystanders who gave of themselves to care for the injured

Since this is the season of Thanksgiving, I am sharing some thoughts of one of her devotions. It is called hammering grace.

Seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you...Therefore, everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. Matthew 7:7, 24.

Martin Luther said, "A nail is driven out by another nail; habit is overcome by habit." I am sad for all that would have changed if I only had.

There is a way to live the big of giving thanks in all things. It is this: to give thanks in this one small thing. The moments will add up.

And give thanks for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Ephesians 5:20

Slapping a sloppy brush of thanksgiving over everything leaves us deeply thankful for very few things. Life-changing gratitude does not fasten to a life unless nailed through with one very specific nail at a time.

The habit of discontentment can only be driven out by hammering in one iron sharper. The sleek pin of gratitude.

Some days, ones with laundry and kids and dishes in the sink, it is hard to think that the insulting ordinariness of this truly teaches the full mystery of the all most important, to be thankful, eucharisteo.

Learning requires practice. C.S. Lewis said, "if you think of this world as a place intended simply for our happiness, you find it quite intolerable; think of it as a place of training and correction and it's not so bad." Practicing gratitude is the hardest part of learning, and training is the essence of transformation. It might save your life.


OUTREACH
